Watch Candlelight Carols and the Lighting of the Menorah




Enjoy talented student-musicians and the readings of students who support the work of the chaplain's office.

Visit the new Wofford College U.S. Military Memorial



On a gorgeous fall day, the Wofford College community dedicated a new military memorial on campus. The event was led by the Southern Guards ROTC Battalion, and Col. Herb Franklin '88, U.S. Army chaplain, offered the invocation.

Established in 2024 to honor those who died during active military service, the Wofford College U.S. Military Memorial is the work of many, and Wofford alumni and staff military veterans led the way, sharing their ideas for a memorial and inspiring action. In addition to honoring those who died during active military service, the memorial has markers recognizing:

- Wofford's Reserve Officers' Training Corps, organized Oct. 18, 1919.
- All veterans.
- The peacemakers.

The college dedicated the memorial, which is located between Main Building and DuPré House, on Nov. 16 before the Military Appreciation football game. The special service featured the Woodwind Quintet and Bugler from the 282nd Army Band from Fort Jackson; a Southern Guards formation, drill ceremony and presentation of the colors; an invocation by Col. Herb Franklin '88; the singing of the national anthem by Maj. Jessica Georgi; remarks from President Nayef Samhat and Lt. Col. Nicole Dallocchio; and an inspirational address of remembrance by Lt. Gen. Scott Dingle, retired U.S. Army Surgeon General. The college bell tolled for each alumnus memorialized, and students from the Dorman High School Cavalier Battalion read the names of the fallen.
