Need to ask a quick question or need some guidance to help your student? You can email parents@wofford.edu in addition to emailing Thom.

Parenting a college student can present many challenges and stressors. The list below comes from from conversations I've had with parents:

- Emotional adjustment: Parents may struggle with the emotional challenges of their student leaving home and transitioning into a new phase of life, such as feelings of loss or worry about their student's well-being.
- Communication challenges: As college students become more independent, parents may find it difficult to navigate changes in their relationship and communication patterns.
- Academic concerns: Parents might worry about their student's academic
 performance, time management skills or ability to balance college with extracurricular
 activities and social life.
- Uncertainty about the future: As college students explore potential career paths and life choices, parents may face stress related to uncertainty about their student's future and whether they are making the right decisions.

The good news is there are ways to navigate this transformative time in your student's life.

- Maintain open lines of communication with your college student. This builds trust and fosters understanding.
- Embrace the changes that come with this new phase. Remember: this is an
 opportunity for both you and your student to grow.
- Share your concerns and discuss expectations together but also be willing to listen to their perspectives.
- When faced with academic concerns, encourage your student to take advantage
 of the numerous campus resources available, such as tutoring centers and academic
 advising. Wofford has many people who are ready and willing to be of assistance to
 your student.
- Every student's journey is unique, and trusting in your student's ability to make responsible decisions and grow from their experiences will ultimately strengthen your relationship and promote their success in college and beyond.
- Embrace this new chapter in both of your lives with positivity and enjoy witnessing your student flourish as they engage this exciting adventure.

Travel grants for Interim 2025 travel/study programs – Students who were awarded a travel grant for interim 2025 travel/study programs were notified individually via email on Sept. 20. Please contact our office with any questions related to these awards.

Interim 2025 travel/study program billing – The Wofford Business Office will post bills for all Interim 2025 Travel/Study program fees to student accounts on October 10. Payments are due in full on November 15. See the Interim calendarfor more important information and dates, including information on the Interim 2025 faculty-led travel/study withdrawal schedule.

Withdrawal policy for Interim 2025 travel/study programs – Participants intending to withdraw from a faculty-led travel/study program must submit a notice of their withdrawal via email to the Office of International Programs at internationalprograms@wofford.edu. The effective date of the withdrawal will be based on the Office's acknowledged receipt of the email. In the case of a participant's voluntary withdrawal from a faculty-led program prior to departure, the Withdrawal Policy Faculty-Led Travel/Study Interims applies to payments made by the withdrawn participant (cancellation fees may apply based on the participant's date of withdrawal). Note: All applicants are required to read and sign a copy of this policy to be considered for admission to their selected faculty-led travel/study program.

All travel/study programs sponsored by one of Wofford's off-campus study partners have their own individual policies for withdrawal, and they provide this policy information to all participants. Providers also typically publish their withdrawal policies on their websites, and, if needed, participants can find a link to their provider's homepage on their program's **online brochure**. In the case of a participant's voluntary withdrawal from a provider-sponsored program prior to departure, the participant should follow any procedures outlined in their provider's withdrawal policy, and they must also submit a notice of their withdrawal via email to the Office of International Programs at **internationalprograms@wofford.edu**.

Travel insurance for Interim 2025 travel/study programs – Given the uncertainties associated with travel, Wofford College highly recommends that all students participating in Interim travel/study programs consider purchasing travel insurance (also commonly referred to as "trip insurance"). Travel insurance is coverage designed to protect against risks and financial losses resulting from travel interruption (e.g., delayed travel) or travel cancellation. While Wofford recommends that participants consider travel insurance, it is not required, and individual participants are responsible for the decision to purchase such insurance. (Please note that travel insurance is separate from international health insurance, though some travel insurance plans may include some health/medical benefits. All Interim travel/study program participants will be enrolled in an international health insurance plan, the cost of which is included in the program fee.) Applicants interested in purchasing travel insurance should investigate options as soon as possible, since benefits and eligibility may depend on either the date of enrollment into the program or the date that the student's bill for the program is paid. Travel insurance providers often require individuals to enroll in a plan no later than 14-21 days after paying their program fees. The cost, coverage, eligibility requirements, and other terms and conditions of travel insurance vary; so as you consider your options, please refer to

individual provider and plan details for more information. Wofford College has identified several possible plans that participants may be interested in considering, and these recommendations can be found on the "Insurance & Withdrawal Policy" tab of each program's **online brochure**. Those participating in programs sponsored by Wofford's off-campus study partners should also read their program's terms and conditions and refer to any additional travel insurance recommendations made by their study abroad program, if applicable.

Advising for fall/summer 2025 study abroad – Students interested in studying abroad during the fall or summer 2025 term can meet with international programs staff in person or virtually. Students can sign up for an advising appointment here. The fall/summer 2025 application deadline for most programs is March 1. See here for programs with earlier deadlines.

C. Yorke Lawson Cultural Immersion Scholarship – The generous C. Yorke Lawson Cultural Immersion Scholarship is designed to support ambitious students wishing to study abroad for a full academic year with a focus on cultural integration.
